These committees are made up of volunteers who care about where they live and want to make a positive difference.

What is a Community Management Committee?

A Community Management Committee (CMC) is an incorporated body made up of local volunteers to help support and strengthen their township and surrounding district.

CMCs work to:

- Represent local community interests
- Help manage community facilities and public spaces
- Support local events and activities
- Encourage volunteering and community participation
- Develop projects that improve their town
- Provide feedback and advice to Regional Council of Goyder



What do Community Management Committees Do?

>> Be the Voice of the Community

CMCs provide an important link between local residents and other organisations. They identify community needs, raise local issues, and help ensure that community voices are heard.

>> Help Manage Community Assets

Many committees assist with the care and management of community facilities that play a vital role in bringing communities together including:

- Town halls
- Recreation reserves
- Community meeting spaces
- Sporting clubs
- Some CMC's also run businesses such as Op Shops, Visitor Information Outlets, Museums and Caravan Parks!

>> Support Events and Activities

CMCs often help organise and support events that make our towns great places to live and visit, including:

- Community celebrations
- Markets and festivals
- Volunteer activities
- Tourism initiatives
- Cultural and heritage projects

>> Build Stronger Communities

Committees bring people together, support local groups, and help attract new ideas and opportunities for their towns. They help local groups connect and collaborate.
